Use *can* to describe ability.

### Affirmative and negative

I / You / He / She / It / We / They	can	play ...
	can't (cannot)	

### Questions

Can	I / you / he / she / it / we / they	play ...?
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### Short answers

Yes, I can.	No, I can't.
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*Can* is a modal verb. This means no third person *s*.

Say *He can play the guitar*. (don't say *He cans play the guitar*.)

### Adverbs of manner

- Use adverbs of manner to talk about how we do something:

*He can play the guitar really well.*

*She can't run very fast.*

- Put the adverb of manner at the end of the sentence.

Say *He can play the saxophone really well*.

*He can play really well.*

(don't say *He can play really well the saxophone*.)

**Key vocabulary** Adverbs of manner: (really/very) well/badly/beautifully/fast/slowly not very well = badly
