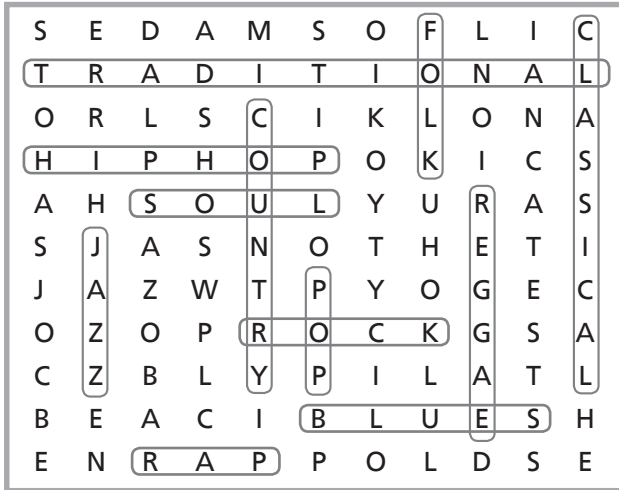

Sample response:

Student A: What's the name of the artist?

Student B: His name is Christian Grayling.

Student A: What type of artwork does he do?

Student B: He does abstract sculptures.

Student A: Where is the gallery?

Student B: It's the Whiteside Gallery on Limes Road.

Student A: Is there public transport to the gallery?

Student B: Yes, there is – there are two bus routes. The 47 and 36b.

Student A: When does the exhibition run until?

Student B: It runs until 31st May.

Student A: How much do the tickets cost?

Student B: The tickets cost £4.00. Half price for senior citizens and children under 12.

Student A: What are the opening times?

Student B: Monday to Friday 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. and Saturday 12 p.m. to 6 p.m.

Student A: Is there a cafe or restaurant available?

Student B: Yes, there's a cafe open daily from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Student A: What are the exhibition reviews saying?

Student B: They're good reviews. 'Don't miss this opportunity to see Grayling's super art.' and 'So good, I went twice'.

Student B: What's the name of the play?

Student A: It's called Abigail's Party.

Student B: What type of play is it?

Student A: It's a modern comedy.

Student B: Where is the theatre?

Student A: It's The Grand Theatre on Talbot Road.

Student B: Is there public transport to the theatre?

Student A: Yes, there is. You can take the train – the theatre is opposite Kingsway railway station.
